Cloverlea School Values . . .

Thank you to all those families who have been returning the forms about the Schools Values. Nearly 1/3 of our families responded. Staff voted, students in year 3 – year 6 voted and parents voted. With all the votes counted, each acronym was given a ranking from 1 – 6, with the acronym most liked receiving 1, second highest vote receiving 2 and so on. The acronym, with the values that was most liked by the students was LEGEND. LEGEND was the second most liked acronym for staff and third most liked acronym from the parents who returned the forms.
