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PRINCIPALS PEN

I was really excited catching up with our **LEGENDs** over the week. It had felt like a long time since I had seen them after being away in the last week of school. Five other tumuaki and I spent 10 days learning about whakapapa and the waka voyage, using Scotty Morrisons Origins series as a basis. We visited Rarotonga and saw where all 7 waka left to voyage to New Zealand, we went on a cultural safari and visited Te Ngira which was used by Kupe to navigate to the East Coast, we went to Aitutaki and made further connects with the Kiingitanga, travelled to Raiatea and visited Taputapuatea (the most sacred place where the waka also voyaged but where some of the first marae are), spent time in Moorea visiting the middle of the Pacific where all the voyages started. I sent some photos back each day for our **LEGENDs** to see and they could see our values in action - I was very **resilient** in some of the learning activities and also **resilient** being in countries where English was not spoken.

Prior to me going, I had collected 3 stones from the Manawatū awa (river) and they had been around all the classes being held by our **LEGENDs**. These were then placed in special places on my journey - 1 was left next to the acknowledgement of Rangitāne waka Kurahaupo, 1 was left on the marae at Taputapuatea and the last 1 was left in the water at Raiatea. Our **LEGENDs** had lots of questions when I have seen them and our learning for next year is connected to this trip as well as navigation.

In the 1800's this was known for its tall wooden viewing platform called Te Pūhara o Turitea (the sentry watchtower of Turitea). It was 15 metres tall and provided unobstructed views of any activity on the awa. We saw Craig Kawana's mahi toi as we looked at the pou. We are excited to see what he does for our tomokanga.
