PRINCIPALS PEN

We have had a great start to the term with many **LEGENDs** who were excited to be back once they saw their friends! Learning this week began with reminders around school routines and our school goal focussed on this through being '**organised**'. We expect our **LEGENDs** to hang their bags up, zip their bags, put their shoes in twos and ensure that any rubbish is put in the right place. We expect our **LEGENDs** to be in the correct uniform and that they begin to take responsibility for their uniform. The learning this week focussed around what our **LEGENDs** thought was important to be told in the tomokanga that is being carved next year. All classes learnt what a tomokanga was, how each tomokanga has a story, how each tomokanga is special to a place and our **LEGEND** ideas will help tell the Cloverlea story.

This term, we will also focus a bit around the Olympics and around Whangai Mokopuna. Each team has a different aspect of learning so our **LEGENDs** will have science experiences, technology experiences, digital technology experiences and health experiences. HEALTH INFORMATION

We have recently had a new **LEGEND** enrol who is in our junior team. This **LEGEND** has Cystic Fibrosis and with whānau permission, they are happy for our community to be made aware of this. As a school, we have a plan in place to support and thought it would be a good idea for everyone to learn a bit more about what Cystic Fibrosis is.

What is Cystic Fibrosis?

Cystic Fibrosis affects the exocrine glands in the body, so that it produces a very thick mucus which can clog organs, blocking the pancreas, lungs and intestines. This then can lead to severe respiratory problems. It will often mean that they may have an extremely bad cough that for many of us, we would sound incredibly sick with, but this is this student's 'norm'.

Will your **LEGEND** 'catch' Cystic Fibrosis?

No, this is a hereditary medical condition so cannot be passed on.

What does this mean?

Living with Cystic Fibrosis means they will need to have medication multiple times throughout the day, particularly for eating, that is a high fat diet and has a strict toileting and cleaning routine to eliminate the potential of germs.

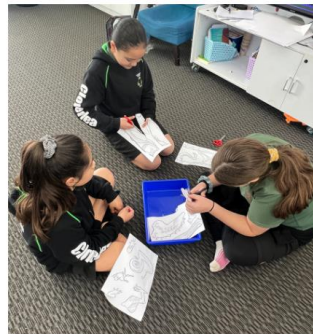
