Cloverlea School Ballot information for 2025

Enrolment at Cloverlea School is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office. Parents of students who live within the home zone and **intend enrolling their child at any time during the next year** should notify the school as soon as possible to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.

Out of Zone Students

The board has determined that up to Forty New Entrant/Year 1 places are likely to be available for out-of-zone students in Priorities 2-5 for the next year.

There are also:

2 spaces in Year 2, 0 spaces in Year 3, 8 spaces in Year 4, 1 space in Year 5 and 1 space in Year 6

Our first ballot will open on the 29th of October 2024 and close on the 29 November 2024. This is for any **Legend** wanting to come to Cloverlea School for 2025. If your **Legend** doesn't turn 5 until July this is still a good opportunity to go in this ballot, so it gives you piece of mind.
