PRINCIPALS PEN

Each year, the Ministry of Education gives all schools 2 Teacher Only Days that are set within 2-week timeframes. This means there are multiple schools across Aotearoa that will have different days within the 2 weeks to undertake professional learning. We also do professional learning in the school holidays, but this isn't advertised as much, since it doesn't impact whānau.

Cloverlea Staff had a great Teacher Only Day on Monday. We spent the morning session with Craig Kawana visiting the tomokanga at Te Kura o Wairau and Central Normal as he shared the kōrero (meaning) of these. Staff then spent time in groups sharing their kōrero of Cloverlea and what we thought was important to be told. In the middle session, we went through the ERO indicators and placed ourselves using their steps of what we are doing and what we need to continue to work on. The afternoon was a sharing session around the staff who went to Waitangi for a Conference and planning ideas for term 3 and term 4 using the pūrākau Whangai Mokopuna. Not only do we have some exciting learning experiences for our **LEGENDs**, but we are putting together a real authentic curriculum where our **LEGENDs** will learn Science, Social Studies, parts of Maths, Reading, Writing and Technology through something that relates to Palmerston North, to Rangitāne.
