BOARD UPDATE

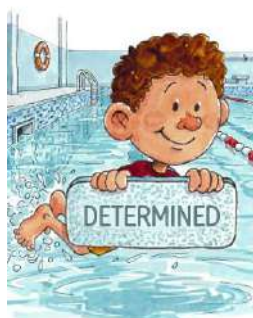
Last night the Cloverlea School board attended Te Tiriti training at Manchester St school alongside 4 other local schools.

HAUORA EDUCATION WHĀNAU HUI:

Ruahine Team (Rooms 6,7,8) are focusing on Hauora (Health and Wellbeing) for term 2. Hauora is a Māori philosophy of health unique to Aotearoa. It comprises of: taha tinana (physical), taha hinengaro (mental and emotional), taha whānau (social), taha wairua (the spiritual dimension). Part of this learning will be a series of lessons around puberty built around the big idea 'We are iNclusive and rEsilient Through Change!'. We will be holding a whānau hui on Tuesday 24th March at 5:30pm to provide you with information about what will be included in these sessions and how you can support this learning at home. This is a parent only hui, if you do need to bring your **LEGEND**, there will be a movie set up in Room 7.

Rūma rua has been rae pakari to learn new skills with different Swim Magic instructors. **LEGENDs** showed manawaroa when stepping out of their comfort zone in the water. We had lots of kōrero about water safety and its importance as we are always so close to water in Aotearoa! Activities and skills we practiced included safe entry, accidental entry, swimming like different animals, team races that involved diving and how to float like different letters and shapes. We practiced floating when we pretended that flutter boards were obstacles in a river and tried to be rae pakari to avoid them.
